## MYART Volunteer Requirements

All MYART volunteers (18 years and older) are required to do a background check. There is a small fee of \$25 and is good for 3 years. However, if you have had a background check and can provide the results to MYART, we will accept that as well. The link for the background check is <a href="https://www.verifiedvolunteers.com">www.verifiedvolunteers.com</a> and enter the Good Deed code **t0qdmi0**.

Also, as MYART is a Youth Service Organization, therefore a new law (AB 506) requires volunteers (18 years and older) to complete training in child abuse and neglect identification and reporting. MYART has three acceptable options to meet this requirement:

- 1. If you currently work in the capacity as a mandated reporter in your employment or are a volunteer for another youth service organization (i.e.: Girl/Boy Scouts) and have completed mandated/volunteer reporter training, you may provide proof of employment or certificate to MYART.
- 2. You may take a FREE 2 hour online mandated reporter training course at your leisure, on <a href="https://mandatedreporterca.com/training/volunteers">https://mandatedreporterca.com/training/volunteers</a>.

  Once complete please provide certificate to MYART.
- 3. MYART will be offering a 1 hour in person training at GRACE during rehearsals on the following dates: **Tue, Dec. 13**<sup>th</sup> & **Thur, Jan 5**<sup>th</sup>

All Training and Background Checks MUST be completed by the start of Tech Week on January 7, 2023.

**NOTE** – for those providing mandated reporter proof:

- While volunteering your time with MYART you are not a mandated reporter, even if you are during the course of your employment.
- Although volunteers are NOT Mandated Reporters by law... Per MYART policies you are required to report/discuss suspected abuse to the adult MYART staff on premises. Adult MYART staff ARE mandated reporters.
- The Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act (CANRA): California Penal Code 11165-11174.3, requires mandated reporters to report suspected child abuse or neglect to any police, sheriff or county welfare department.
